Dear Fellow Believers and Friends,

There is not much to report in relation to our ministy except that we will not be able to travel out west this year. That is one of the saddest things that I have ever had to admit. We needed to stay in Greenville last year to help William and Nowelle transition to being on their own, but we always had the desire and intention to return to the road in 2020. The first part of this year I began to reach out, as possible, to let everyone know that we intended to return to the road and travel wherever the Lord would want to use us. Then the coronavirus hit and turned everything upside down. I sent out e-mails twice in May but never heard back from anyone. I waited to hear back from our May NewsLetter when I mentioned that we were ready to return to the road, but again, no one responded. I knew that it would be very difficult to return to the road right now. Many churches are still not having services. Others have just recently returned to having services. Many are struggling financially, so it would be very difficult to have a visiting preacher in for any services. Again, I understood that and was prepared for that, but it is still very disappointing to not be able to do what the Lord has called you to do.

There is some good news to report. William has found a full-time job. He is delivering food with the same company that I deliver with. He has said that he likes it. I recommended that he do it for a year. By then, he will be 21 and might be able to find a job driving a delivery truck somewhere or find an even better paying job doing something else.

Nowelle has been officially accepted to Baptist College of Ministry. She completed her final interview a couple of weeks ago and received her official acceptance letter soon after. She still has some trepidation about the weather in Wisconsin, but we keep reminding her that Baptist College of Ministry is the best college for her. Their music and dress standards are still strong. There are very few colleges like that left. Most have departed from the truth and practicing holiness for compromise and worldliness. There are only two or three colleges that I would recommend to anyone, and I believe that for Nowelle, Baptist College of Ministry is where she should go. The Lord has provided the money that she needs for the first semester, and we are trusting Him to provide for the second semester and beyond.

What are we going to do for the remainder of 2020? We will serve the Lord as He allows. We are hoping that we might be able to travel some in the Southeast. If a pastor wants us to come for a Sunday, or if He needs me to fill in for him while he is gone, I can do that. Again, we will serve as we can, as opportunities arise now, and plan to return to the road full-time in 2021.

I do plan to continue sending out the NewsLetter for the remainder of the year. We will be able to stay in touch in that manner. Brethren, pray for us as you can.
